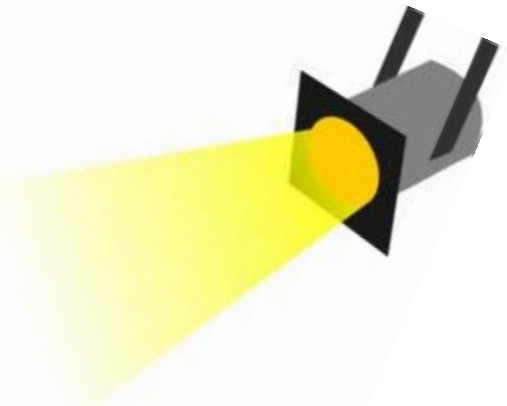
A spotlight on Toby Langley

Lake Jordan Home Owners and Boat Owners Association Minutes of Quarterly Membership Meeting * July 27, 2015

The Lake Jordan Home Owners/Boat Owners Association Quarterly Membership Meeting was called to order by President Gerald Hardy at 7:00pm on July 27, 2015 at Camp Chandler on Lake Jordan.

The Invocation was given by Tim Owen.

Gerald Hardy, declared that a quorum was present to conduct business and called the meeting to order.

Gerald welcomed everyone, and newcomers and guests introduced themselves.

President's Remarks

Gerald brought up the issue of purchasing liability insurance for the Lake Jordan HOBO Association. Marci Williams obtained 3 quotes. The first quote was for Event Coverage only and the annual premium cost is \$235. The second quote is for General Liability coverage at an annual premium cost of \$622 and the final quote is for General Liability plus Officer/Director coverage at an annual cost of \$993. No action has been taken on purchasing insurance at this time.

The Alabama Wildlife Federation is holding its annual Elmore County Water Festival on August 25, 26 and 27 at the Alabama Nature Center in Millbrook. The Lake Jordan HOBO Association will support this Festival again this year with a \$500 Grant.

The large HOBO sign on the Holtville side of the lake was damaged due to a car wreck. Thanks to Wayne Turner's efforts, funds have been received to have the sign repaired and reinstalled.

The Alabama Clean Water Partnership will hold its "The Coosa River Basin State of Our Watershed" conference on Thursday, October 8, 2015 from 9:00am until 3:30 at the Pell City Civic Center. Lunch will be provided. For more information please visit www.cleanwaterpartnership.org/events.

On behalf of the Lake Jordan HOBO Association, President Hardy sent a letter to the Alabama Environmental Management Commission supporting the recommendation that has been made to designate Lake Jordan as a "Treasured Alabama Lake".

The Election of the Lake Jordan HOBO Association Officers and Board members will take place at the next meeting on October 26, 2015. Please contact Gerald

Hardy or any of the current Officers or Board Members if you are interested in serving.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes from the April 27th, 2015 Quarterly HOBO Association meeting. The motion carried.

Tommy Counts presented the Financial Report dated June 30, 2015 with an ending non-restricted cash balance of \$42,893.08. A motion to approve the financial report as written was made and seconded. The motion carried."

Mark Tow with Alabama Power was present at the meeting informing the membership about the Alabama Power Vector Control program. His discussion largely focused on the various types of mosquitoes (approximately 30 different species) that are present in our area, the diseases that are transmitted by them and the efforts to treat and control the mosquito population. Also, educating the public about what can be done to reduce the problem is very important. The best way to control mosquitoes around one's home is to eliminate standing water. Disposing of all containers that hold water (cans, buckets, flower pots, etc) on your property, cleaning bird baths weekly, keeping boats properly covered and drained and eliminating standing water in ditches and puddles are just a few of the ways that will help reduce mosquito breeding sites on one's property. Keep in mind that mosquitoes are most active one hour before sunrise and 1 hour before sunset. If you have any questions about the mosquito control efforts, please call Alabama Power Vector Control at 1 800 525-3711.

Josh Yerby was also present and discussed Alabama Power's spray program. Non-Native Vegetation such as Hydrilla is harmful to the lake and needs to be reported if seen. Other than for harmful plant control, Alabama Power will spray areas where the vegetation poses a threat to power, limits recreation or is a breeding area for mosquitoes. Ernie Pritchard announced that Alabama Power doesn't plan to let the water down until September of 2018.

Committee Reports

Lake Clean Up – Barbara Dreyer reported that the date is set for the 2016 Annual Lake Clean Up. Mark your calendars for April 23, 2016!

Water Quality – Judy May reported that we recently lost 2 water monitors, one on each side of the lake. We currently have 5 testers on the Titus Side and 4 testers on the Holtville side of the Lake. Anyone who is interested in becoming certified as a water tester, please contact Judy May at 334 567-7327.

Lake Safety – Dave Kowalski reminded everyone to be sure your electrical outlets located near the water are ground fault protected. Remember to always use common sense and common courtesy around other boaters. Also keep watch for floating trees and logs. All of the above will help to prevent accidents.

Fireworks – Michael Wood talked about the recent July 4th fireworks show and the effects that the rain and moisture had on the ignition of the fireworks. Because the weather wasn't actively storming and because it would have been difficult to get the word out to people at short notice of a decision to cancel, there was no choice but to go forward with the show even though the weather conditions weren't favorable for shooting off fireworks. We'll hope for more cooperative weather next year and, thankfully, we already have money in the budget toward the 2016 July 4th show.

Dave White gave an update on the "Water Wars" Impacting River Basins in Alabama, Georgia and Florida. Discussion began with a summary of the various actions taken to resolve the "water war" issues. He overviewed the almost 25 years of actions taken by the Corps of Engineers to satisfy the conflicts involving

the Apalachicola-Chattahoochee-Flint (ACF) River Basin as well as the Alabama-Coosa-Tallapoosa (ACT) Basin. He summarized the legal cases, compacts and numerous other efforts to bring all states and stakeholders to agreement. Unfortunately, there is still no standing agreement concerning the ACF but Georgia is pushing new initiatives to bring a solution. The ACT basin issues are not as critical as those in the ACF basin but still conflicts and lawsuits are active. The Corp of Engineers issued a Record of Decision for Updates to the Master Water Control Manual for the Alabama-Coosa-Tallapoosa River Basin in May 2015. After a review of the decision of the State of Alabama, Governor Bentley filed a lawsuit challenging the Water Control manual. The suit claims the manual is illegal and unfair. It requests the federal government to adopt a lawful manual that respects Alabama's interests. There has been an initiative by Georgia Governor Deal to work with the governors of Florida and Alabama to resolve the disputes but no official specifics concerning the effort have been published to date. Dave indicated renewals of serious negotiations are unlikely to proceed until another crippling drought occurs.

Meeting Barbara Dreyer

Barbara Dreyer and her husband, Ed, have been on Lake Jordan so long that they were able to name their street. The name – WELUVIT Lane – says it all. They love it on Lake Jordan and are some of the lake's biggest supporters. They have been living on the lake since 1973 and Barbara's been at the center of most activities there for decades.



In 1991, she gathered a group of her friends and began the lake's first HOBO (Home Owners Boat Owners Association), hoping to take a more active role in the lake's preservation.

"We had heard about lakes all over the country that had become so polluted they couldn't be used," Dreyer said. "And we didn't want that to happen to ours. It was not that we had any major problem – it was that we didn't want a problem."

The group's first annual cleanup of the lake took place in September 1991. Shortly thereafter, Doug Powell – now retired from Alabama Power Company, but who was a staff environmental specialist for the company – made efforts to get more involved in cleanup efforts after speaking to the group. Today, because of Powell's early participation many cleanups are coordinated in conjunction with the Alabama Power Renew Our Rivers program.

Lake Jordan, Alabama's Hidden Gem

Lake Jordan is a bit of a hidden Alabama gem, but fishing has attracted the Bassmaster Classic Tournament and the lake is active throughout the summer season with sailing, watersports and kids from the nearby YMCA Camp Chandler. "We feel like (Lake Jordan) is one of the greatest lakes in the state, if not the country," Dreyer said. Dreyer, who was raised in the Wetumpka area, takes pride in a lake she's seen evolve over the past several decades. "The biggest change (I saw) was when the power company started selling the lots to the people," she said. "People bought (houses) and started upgrading. It brought about a real good improvement to the lake to have a lot of these houses that were just not in the best of shape torn down and have new houses put in. People felt like before, when the land was not theirs that it could be taken from them at any time. But once they bought the land, then they were ready to put more investment into it."

Beyond the beauty, serenity and quality fishing Lake Jordan has to offer, Dreyer loves the bonds that connect people on the lake. "We have a really good slough. We have good, good neighbors, and we help each other out. It really is a community up here," Dreyer said of the lake, which features fishing-friendly Blackwell Slough and Swayback Slough in addition to Dreyer's own Blue Heron Slough. "We're not so spread out. We're close, both in proximity and as folks' neighbors. It just encourages more community feeling."

As the original group of HOBOs who helped turn around the lake properties age, Dreyer says younger people have begun investing their time in their longtime efforts.

"Our biggest challenge is trying to keep people motivated with the cleanup. It's not just important now, but for generations to come. We have to keep it clean so that we won't have that problem of pollution," said Dreyer.

Lake Jordan doesn't maintain its beauty through the efforts of a few; it takes an army of passionate volunteers. "One person doesn't do this," said Dreyer. "It takes a lot of people working to get it done, and it also takes the support of local businesses."

That neighborly obligation, combined with the lake's beauty, helps explain the attachment people like Dreyer have found to an out-of-the-way lake without any restaurants. When she speaks about Lake Jordan, Dreyer's voice takes on a blend of humble words with a tone of unmistakable pride. "It's a beautiful lake. It's just the right size for me," Dreyer said, chuckling. "I love it."
