Once the assigned area is clean, trash can then be dropped off at Bonner's Landing. Sack lunches will be provided for easy pick-up along with a free clean-up t-shirt from Alabama Power Company. 
Lake Jordan Cleanup




Lake House Owners Share Etiquette Tips For Guest

Dues are \$25.00 per year. We also encourage members to consider a financial contribution to the Lake Jordan Fireworks Fund.





Hazard Buoy Update

As the weather begins to become nicer and more people start getting out on our beautiful lake,

we would like to remind boaters to be careful in those areas marked with hazard buoys. Lake Jordan HOBO Association assists ALEA in reporting hazards and missing buoys to the ALEA Marine Police. We are currently aware of only one missing hazard buoy in Area 3 near Driftwood Slough. There is another buoy near that same hazard that is still in place but please proceed with caution in that area. The missing buoy has al-



ready been reported to ALEA and is in the process of being replaced. Also the NO Wake buoys at

Bonner the State (Rotary) boat ramps are also on the list to be replaced.

Lake Jordan Home/Boat Owners Association Minutes of the Quarterly Membership Meeting January 25th, 2021

The Lake Jordan Home Owners/Boat Owners Association Quarterly Membership Meeting was called to order by President Jeff Royal at 7:00pm on January 25th, 2021 at Camp Chandler on Lake Jordan.

President Royal thanked everyone for being there and declared that a quorum was present to conduct business. He welcomed everyone and new members and guests introduced themselves.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes from the October 26th, 2020 Quarterly HOBO Association meeting. The motion carried.

Jeff recognized and introduced Brett Wilkinson who has agreed to serve as the new treasurer for the HOBO Association.

The 2021 Lake Jordan HOBO Operating Budget (Resolution 21-01) was presented to the membership for review and approval. The Memorial and Worship Committee Budget was increased slightly to purchase a PA System to be used at the Sunday service at Bonners. After a brief discussion, a motion to approve the budget as written was made and seconded. The motion carried.

Annual \$1,000 checks were presented to local fire departments and Elmore County Search and Rescue that serve Lake Jordan and the surrounding areas. Representatives from Holtville and Buyck Fire Departments were in attendance at the meeting to receive the contributions for their departments. Jeff pointed out how instrumental the fire departments were when setting out the no-wake buoys for the 2020 July 4th Fireworks Show. Holtville Fire Chief Todd McCarley reported that the plan is to do the same for the 2021 Fireworks Show and to extend the no-wake zone further north upriver.

The guest speaker for the meeting was Henry Hines, District 1 Elmore County Commissioner and Area 12 Representative for the HOBO Association. Hines serves on the Infrastructure Committee on the Commission which addresses roads and trash management. Commissioner Hines updated the membership on a variety of topics including the Advanced Disposal buyout by Waste Management, the Central Alabama Cooperative broadband project, Covid-19 vaccination opportunities in Elmore County, county trash pick up services, and road repairs scheduled. 
