Luckily the boy’s screams were not only heard and taken seriously, but the response from multiple witnesses were immediate. The boys, only two of which had life jackets on, were shaken up by

the event but physically fine. The jet-ski was fully submerged to the tip of the bow but was able to be pulled upright and towed to Bonner’s Landing.

A simple reminder that while our lake is a beautiful and normally peaceful sanctuary, the water can be a dangerous playground and safety precautions should always be a priority.



Don't Forget To Renew Your Membership

As you are all aware, your annual Lake Jordan HOBO membership dues are due in January. We appreciate your membership and want our organization to continue to grow each and every year.

spirit resonated and Wetumpka and its' surrounding communities will reap the rewards of this selection for generations to come.

The six-part docuseries will show Ben and Erin Napier leading a team of renovation pros to breathe new life into Wetumpka including several homes; as well as, some locally owned businesses and historic treasures unique to the city.

Lake Jordan Home/Boat Owners Association Minutes of the Quarterly Membership Meeting

July 27, 2020

The Lake Jordan Home Owners/Boat Owners Association Quarterly Membership Meeting was called to order by President Jeff Royal at 7:00pm on July 27th, 2020 at Bonners Landing.

President Royal thanked everyone for being there and declared that a quorum was present to conduct business. Jeff welcomed everyone, and new members and guests introduced themselves. Despite the circumstances, he was excited that the pandemic did provide an opportunity for the HOBO Association to hold the meeting on the Holtville side of the Lake. Jeff also recognized Trooper Corey Robinett who was in attendance.

Jeff talked about the HOBO Organization and how it is truly a family. That the support that we give each other and being there for our neighbors and friends is indicative of who we are.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes from the January 27, 2020 Quarterly HOBO Association meeting. The motion carried.

HOBO Treasurer Tommy Counts presented the Financial Report dated June 30, 2020 with an ending non-restricted cash balance of \$37, 683.11.

On behalf of the HOBO Association, Jeff presented a financial contribution to Daniel Blazer from the YMCA at Camp Chandler. Daniel was very appreciative and informed the membership that the grant will be used to sponsor several campers to attend summer camp at Camp Chandler.

Committee Reports

Memorial and Worship – Wayne Turner pointed out the new cushions that the members present at the meeting were sitting on. The cushions were purchased from funds earmarked in the HOBO Budget for the Memorial and Worship Committee and they are being used each Sunday during the Sunrise Service. Wayne talked about the history of the Memorial and Worship area at Bonners Landing. The lakeside worship service was started in 1956 by Cain's Chapel. The State Highway Department together with the Department of Transportation built the Chapel with the funding support from the Department of Conservation. In the early 90's, the HOBO Association was brought in to oversee the church area and provide financial support. Also, at that time, the HOBOs partnered with Trinity Episcopal Church to coordinate the preachers for each week. This has continued to the present day.

Area Reps – Alan Williams announced that Area 5 is in need of a Representative. Area 5 is on the Titus Side of the lake - Northwest of Island Road, mouth of Weoka Creek, through Gaddis Beach. Anyone who resides in Area 5 and is interested in serving as the Area 5 Rep, please contact Alan. He also reminded the Area Reps that he has New Member Packets available.

Water Quality – Judy May reported that the certification class that was scheduled in April was cancelled. She hopes to have it rescheduled for some time in the Fall. Please contact Judy at 334 567-7327 for information about the certification class. She was happy to report that current testing has been going well and that there has been no sign of E. coli bacteria in the water.

Lake Safety – Dave Kowalski began by commending the organized efforts of the HOBOs, the Marine police, the Holtville Fire Department, and many other volunteers for putting out the no wake buoys for the July 4th Fireworks show. They worked very well! The HOBOs purchased 5 No Wake Buoys that will be used each year. Dave asked the membership to remind

young boaters about safety and the importance of life jackets. Also remind youngsters to check their gas situation so they don't become stranded. Dave also reminded everyone that red and green lights are required on personal water vessels. Please be cautious of people who are swimming in the lake. There was also discussion regarding the need for additional buoys at the Blackwell's bridge.

Fireworks – Nikki Murchison named and thanked all the businesses who sponsored the 2020 July 4th Fireworks show. One half of the total funds needed to pay for the annual show comes from Business sponsors. She also has fireworks t-shirts available for sale for \$20. Jeff recognized and commended Nikki for the outstanding fireworks show this year. Job Well Done!

Governmental Relations – Logan Gray asked Jeff to remind everyone about how important it is to participate in the Census. Federal funding and representation depend on it!!

Boat Parade Committee – Jeff reported that there were about 40 to 50 boats in the July 4th parade this year. It went very well and was a lot of fun!

Lake Clean-Up - Allan and Brenda Basnight discussed the cancellation of the spring 2020 Lake Clean Up and possible options for an organized event in the Fall. He has not gotten a response from Alabama Power about their participation. Allan gave several options for a Fall Clean up. The first is to have an organized lake wide event without Alabama Power's participation. Another option is to not have an organized event and those interested in cleaning their areas on their own time could do so and he could provide trash bags. Lastly, he suggested that the Area Reps could organize a cleanup in each of their Areas. He can get additional bags from Alabama Power if needed.

Allan indicated that we have enough funds to rent a dumpster since we will not be using money to purchase food for a Fall event. He asked all the Area Reps to email him with what they would like to do regarding the suggested options. The date for the 2021 annual event is TBD.
